REGULATIONS FOR U15

Eligibility Under-15 (13-15 years)

2024 Edition - Born in 2011, 2010 and 2011

A1.8.2 U-15 BASEBALL WORLD CUP Each pitcher must complete one day(s) of restas follows:

NUMBER OF RELEASES	DAYS OF REST
1 – 35	Without rest
36 – 50	1 Days
51 – 65	2Days
66 - 80	3Days
Max. 95	4 Days

NOTE: No more than 95 pitches will be allowed.

The Technical Commissioner will ultimately determine the exact pitch count using all information gathered from the official scorers plus his own work and will make final decisions on protests.

A). Official Scorers must accurately record pitch counts, and pitchers who are not available to pitch will be listed on a daily report.

B). Pitch counts thrown by the same pitchers in games on the same day will be added to determine pitcher availability.

C). A pitcher may only pitch three (3) consecutive days, if the pitch count for the two previous days does not exceed thirty-five (35) pitches. It should be noted that when a pitcher pitches on consecutive days, his pitch count from the previous day(s) will be used to determine the number of pitches allowed for that day. For example, if a pitcher throws 34 pitches on two days, he is allowed to pitch on the third day because the total pitch count was less than 35, but he may only throw a maximum of 61 pitches on the third day (maximum of 95 minus the 34).

Whatever the number of pitches thrown in the three consecutive days will determine the number of rest days required.

In the example above, the pitcher would need the full 4 days of rest.

D). If the pitch count is thirty-six (36) or higher on those two days, that pitcher will need one (1) day of rest;

E). The pitcher may not pitch four (4) consecutive days. He will need at least one (1) day of rest; f. When a pitcher reaches any of the thresholds, he will not be able to play as a pitcher according to the corresponding day(s) of rest, however, the pitcher will be able to play as a position player during such rest.

Batting Regulations for the U-15 Baseball World Cup

Bats that are permitted for use in U-15 Baseball World Cups must be certified by the Batted Ball Coefficient of Restitution (BBCOR):

* Bats must be BBCOR certified and clearly marked on the bat;

* The entire bat must be round with a constant radius at any point and the end the striking area must be smooth.

* There should be a direct line from the center of the knob to the center of the large end. The knob and stopper, if present, must be firmly attached.

* The maximum length will be 34 inches (86.4 cm) and the maximum diameter will be 2-5/8 inches (6.67 cm).

* A bat cannot weigh, numerically, more than three units less than the length of the bat. bat (for example, a 34-inch long (86.4 cm) bat cannot weigh less than

31 ounces (878.8 grams) in weight).

One-piece wooden bats may be used as long as they are included on the Official Bat List. WBSC Approved Bats of the current year, which is available on the WBSC website. WBSC.

NOTE: An illegal bat must be removed. Any bat that has been altered will be removed from play.
